

## HUKANUI SCHOOL NAG 3: Personnel

### SCHOOL UNIFORM PROCEDURE

#### **Rationale:**

Hukanui Primary has a school uniform that was introduced in 2005 following consultation with the school community. We believe that wearing our school uniform assists children to develop a sense of identity with, and pride for their school. It also assists the development of the personal values of Respect (for yourself, for others, for your school) and Excellence (we persist to do the best and be the best that we can possibly be).

#### **Guidelines**

##### **1. The Basic School Uniform requirements are:**

##### **BOYS SUMMER**

Gold Polo Shirt and,  
Black Cargo Shorts and,  
Sun smart school hat and,  
Black Sandals, no visible/colourful logos

##### **BOYS WINTER**

Gold Polo Shirt and,  
Black Cargo Shorts with Long socks Gold and White Stripes or,  
Black Cargo  $\frac{3}{4}$  pants  
Black Long Pants and,  
Black or Gold Polar fleece Sweatshirt and/or,  
Black or Gold Polar fleece Jacket and,  
Black Shoes, no visible/colourful logos

##### **GIRLS SUMMER**

Gold Polo Shirt and,  
Black Skort or,  
Black Culottes and,  
Sun smart school hat and,  
Black sandals, no visible/colourful logos

##### **GIRLS WINTER**

Gold Polo Shirt and,  
Black Bootlegs or,  
Black Culottes with/without black socks/tights or,  
Black Skorts with /without black socks/tights and,  
Black or Gold Polar fleece Sweatshirt and/or,  
Black or Gold Polar fleece Jacket and,  
Black Shoes, no visible/colourful logos

## **2. The timetable for the full implementation of the Hukanui School Uniform:**

- ▶ **From 2011** the full uniform is compulsory wearing for all Hukanui students

## **3. The uniform is to be worn at all times with pride, in clean condition.**

- Marking or defacing the school uniform is not acceptable and will be dealt with as a behavioural issue.
- If boys are wearing long socks as part of their uniform choice, these are to be pulled up under the knee. Hats are to be worn in the manner they were designed for.
- If tights or undershirts are worn in winter they must be black in keeping with school uniform colours.
- Jewellery is not to be worn at school due to safety concerns
- Hair ties or clips must be in keeping with the colours of the school uniform.
- If your child is unable to wear the uniform due to an emergency situation a signed letter must be presented to the class teacher explaining the situation.
- If a child does not wear the uniform without written permission they will be given a verbal warning. If this occurs again then a letter will be sent home. Repeated offences will be dealt with as a behavioural issue.

## **4. Uniform requirements for special occasions and performing groups:**

- All students must wear the school uniform when representing the school including events outside of the school grounds.  
This includes, but does not limit it to, the following groups:
  - Kapa Haka
  - School choirs
  - School Bands
  - Chess team
  - Literacy Quiz team
  - Any other activity where the student is representing the school or is asked to wear the uniform by school management.
- In emergencies Hukanui Shirts (Gold Polo Shirt with Black Sleeves) are available upon written request from the Uniform Shop if needed. Black bottoms (shorts/longs/skirt) and black shoes provided by the students are required to accompany the wearing of the Hukanui Shirt in these instances.
- All students must wear the school uniform for official class photographs
- Students not wearing the school uniform as required above may be excluded from photographs, performance groups or special occasions.

## **5. Sports uniforms:**

- Sports uniforms are supplied to students to wear whilst participating in Summer and Winter Sports and representing the School in Sporting events.

- Where sports uniforms are issued for a summer or winter season they must be returned at the end of that season. Uniforms will only be issued on presentation of your receipt to the uniform shop.
- Uniform is to be worn with pride, in clean unmarked condition. Marking or defacing the Sports Uniform is not acceptable.
- Uniforms that are found to be in poor condition when returned will be charged for at a rate of \$25.00 per item, if it is determined that the uniform has not been properly cared for/damaged.
- Sports uniforms are to be returned as soon as practical after the sport has finished in good, clean condition ready for reissue. Uniforms not returned at year-end are charged for at a rate of \$25.00 per item.

### **Conclusion**

We believe that by applying consistent procedures to the wearing of the school uniform we are helping to maintain our standards of excellence so that we can continue to live out our vision statement of being “ A leading learning environment, maximising people’s potential.”
