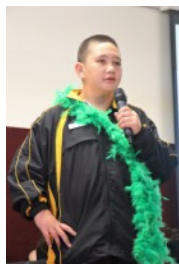

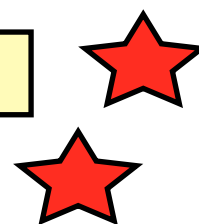
All sports uniforms need to be returned to the office as soon as possible. Please wash them and return in a named bag with the sport played.
